About

The second IUSTUF Digital Interdisciplinary Mini Academy (DIMA II)¹ is organized by a team of students and researchers from the University of Freiburg in cooperation with the National University of Lviv, National University of Kyiv-Mohyla, and the Alfred-Nobel-University of Dnipro. Its goal is to offer support, additional opportunities for education, and a chance for international exchange to students in Ukraine and Germany.

After a successful first round in 2022, DIMA II will run from February 2023 to September 2023. We will offer a broad range of online-taught courses suitable for interdisciplinary exchange and open to participants from all disciplinary backgrounds to students from Ukraine and Freiburg. DIMA II includes courses that are scheduled in line with the Ukrainian and with the German academic year (see course list). We will provide more detailed information on the courses and scholarship opportunities for students that reside in Ukraine within the context of an introductory event in February.

Requirements

To apply for participation in the programme, you must be enrolled in a study programme in Ukraine or Freiburg (regardless of your momentary place of residency). Participants need to have the requisite knowledge of English language at a B2 level or above to be able to actively take part in the courses. Both, students from Ukraine as well as students from Freiburg can obtain ECTS points in their respective study programmes. However, it is advisable to enquire with the administration of your specific study programme to clarify eligibility and specify the number of credits to be received.

First deadline for application is 12. February 2023. This applies also if you are only interested in participating in courses offered in line with the German semester.
